## Our Learning

Each term we will share our main learning focus areas with you. Feel free to get in touch with your child's teacher if you would like more information on your child's specific learning.

### TERM ONE...

Conceptual Curriculum: Our 2024 Concept is Identity and our big understanding is: Identity is shaped by relationships, connections, and/or the environment. All our learning during the year will build on this understanding. We will begin by thinking about our own identity and how our relationships, connections and the environment has helped shape this.

Our context for Term 1 is **Games**. During this learning, we will use a range of games to focus on:

- Understanding that we have personal qualities & strengths that contribute to a sense of self worth
   Developing skills and strategies (such as resilience, self-management, negotiation, risk-taking with acceptable challenge, teamwork, collaboration, problem solving) which support us to manage ourselves and relate well with others.
- **Writing:** The content of our writing, where possible, will be linked to our learning and children's interests. The focus will be on: Sentence Structure developing students' ability to use a variety of sentences, and Ideas working on expanding ideas in a text by adding more information e.g., using their senses.

Reading: We will continue to use a Structured Literacy Approach to Reading. This follows the Science of Reading and research around how children learn to read (please see the scope and sequence that we follow on the last page). Alongside this, we will continue to focus on developing students vocabulary and comprehension of what they read.

**Mathematics**: We will be teaching number knowledge through a range of Mathematical strands this term (shape, number sequence, place value (to at least 1 000), chance and probability).

**Physical Education**: Large Ball Skills - Passing and Catching. This will be integrated with the key competencies of managing self and relating to others.

**Fitness**: Getting our heart rate up! This will be integrated with teamwork & foundation skills such as fine and gross motor development, balance, visual skills, directional language, spatial awareness, midline and hand-eye coordination.

Art: This year we welcome Ms. Hormann to our school as a specialist Art teacher. All Haemata students will have 4 half day sessions with Ms Hormann in Room 13.



#### Conifer Grove School's Scope & Sequence...

Most students in Haemata will be somewhere in Stage 7. During this time, a range of non-decodable texts will also be introduced. During teaching, we gradually introduce the spelling rules and patterns we need to know in order to read and write in English.
