From the Principal...

Student cellphones at school - with new legislation change, we strongly recommend students do not bring these devices to school with them. If a student does bring their cellphone for emergency contact or health reasons, these must be handed to the teacher to be locked away. Our approach is "away for the day", meaning the device should be turned off, and handed in to the teacher to be locked away during the school day.

It is important to note that if students do make the decision to bring a cellphone onto the school grounds, they do so at their own risk. The school is not responsible for any loss or damage caused to any cellphone. Should a cellphone be discovered in a students possession, a caregiver may be informed, the device must be handed to the staff member and kept at the school office for collection at the end of the day. Students should not use smartwatches for communication during school hours.

We understand that some parents like their children to have a phone to communicate with them after school, cellphones will be available for students during the after school pick up time. If a parent or caregiver needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the front office. Next week we will be sending out a form for caregivers to give us information to support the school's policy starting in Term 2.

Attendance Percentages - it is great to see improvements to our school attendance - it is important that your tamariki (children) are regularly at school - this supports the continuity that our Kaiako (teachers) seek, to be able to clearly focus on student achievement.

Parking and Road Safety

After several instances of unsafe road behaviour on Evanda Cres, near the dairy, roundabout and intersection over the bridge, we have requested that the Auckland Transport wardens make extra visits to our area.

Evanda Cres* has a **NO STOPPING ZONE opposite the school office during pick up/drop times.

*PLEASE do not make dangerous turns at our school gates.

*PLEASE do not pull into driveways to drop off children.

*Having trouble finding a carpark? Try parking in one of the cul de sac streets and walk through the walkways into school, or parking further away and walking is a great option.

*PLEASE take care on our roads and have consideration for ALL of our students when dropping off and collecting children - this is a 40kmph zone and ensure you are modelling good road safety by using the allocated pedestrian crossings.
