TERM 3 LEARNING

Literacy: We will still be following the Structured Literacy scope and sequence in Reading. Some groups will also be taught a range of spelling rules from the Code. Our focus in Writing through the Syntax Project will be sentence structure, organisation and punctuation.

Math: This term in the Junior School, we will be starting a new math programme called Numicon. Please see the column on the right to learn more about Numicon.

P.E: Mrs Rich will continue to teach a number of small/big ball skills as well as Movewell games to our tamariki. This term she will be teaching Room 9 and 10. In class our P.E focus will be on cross country/fitness, athletics and Movewell games.

School Values: This term we are focusing on Manaaki (Caring) for ourselves, others and our environment.

Art: There will still be art classes running which will give children the opportunity to explore different mediums. This term Room 11 and 12 will be attending art classes.

Conceptual: Our conceptual learning is about Music and how music can change.

NUMICON

What is Numicon?

Numicon is a fun, hands-on way of helping children understand maths by seeing and feeling numbers. It uses colourful shapes with holes representing numbers 1 to 10, helping children easily spot patterns like 'one more' or 'one less'.

Many schools use Numicon to build strong maths foundations, showing how numbers connect—for example, how 5 and 5 make 10, or how you can use 2s, 5s, or 10s to help with times tables and number patterns. It helps children develop confidence and success with maths in a visual, practical way.
